



Economy of Regions announces a call for papers for an upcoming Special Issue “Prospects for Geo-Economic Partnership between Russia and China” Vol. 21, Is. 3, September 2025

The regions of Russia and China possess the essential natural, human, industrial, scientific and technological potential and are the place of convergence the various cultures and civilizations. These two regions largely determinate the vector of geo-economic transformations and post-global world order. Comparative analysis of new formats of geo-economic partnership, as well as of strategies, programs and results of their socio-economic development will bring Russia and China together for ensuring the stability of the world economy, increasing the level of population welfare and the development of high-tech sectors, providing the mechanisms reciprocal protection of investments and regulatory convergence of cooperation in various areas. - Development of joint measures for increasing the competitiveness in the sphere of advanced technologies
- Perspectives of coordinated policy implementation in the area of demography and population, ecology and agrifood safety
- Experience of trans-border partnership within the Greater Eurasian partnership, “One Belt – One Road” Initiative, Shanghai Cooperation Organization and BRICS

Article formatting requirements:

The journal accepts Russian- and English-language research articles. The length of the article should be 17 – 23 typewritten pages (35 000 – 45 000 characters). Articles are accepted in *.rtf or *.docx formats. Page layout: 2.5 cm margins on all sides, single spacing, standard tab (1.27 cm), font Times New Roman 14 pt. The article should be structured; the IMRAD format is preferred:

- Introduction;
- Theory;
- Data and Methods;
- Methods or Model;
- Results;
- Conclusions or Discussion and Implication.

The article should have at least 25 sources in the list of references. Sources should be listed in alphabetical order, referenced in accordance with the APA style. Before submitting the manuscript, please check the sections [Journal policies](#) and [Formatting guidelines](#) on the website.
